

## **Gorongosa National Park**

## **A Unique Natural History**

Founded in 1960, Gorongosa National Park was one of the most imposing nature reserves in Africa. After it was partly destroyed by poaching, the park has been rehabilitated and re-opened its doors in 1998 with a return to the emblematic fauna of the region.

Despite the exceptional damages that have been done to the park in the past, today it is home to a large **number of** wild animals. With a bit of luck you can view antelope, impalas, hippopotamus, elephants, and even lions. Outside of wildlife viewing, the wild landscapes found in the park are exceptional.

Chart your course by <u>4x4</u> to the misty mountains of Chimanimani for an extraordinary experience in the heart of its **dense forests**. These forests boast close to 100 native species, known for their **medicinal qualities**, and a large variety of bird species such as the barred long-tailed cuckoo, southern banded snake eagle, and the chirinda apalis.
