New Zealand's culinary habits are close to those in Australia, particularly the **barbecue**. In both countires the barbecue involves eating good meat in a friendly atmosphere with friends or neighbours. The **Pavlova** and **Vegemite** are two typical products of both countries. But New Zealand still has specialties and products of its own. Firstly, **the seafood!** The country is made up of two relatively narrow islands and is generally seafood oriented. The snapper, caught at sea, and the freshwater trout are alwys very good.

Each region of southern New Zealand also has its **local beer**, Speights being the most well known. Many products, specialities and cooking methods have been influenced by **traditional Maori methods**. Therefore we can find dried eel, kunamara which is a variety of sweet potato, paua shell and hangi, a Maori **method of cooking** involving making an oven from hot stones and steam.

New Zealand has quickly become an important and renowned wine country on the international stage. In your motorhome you can take the Classic New Zealand Wine Trail, a circuit of 120 vineyards including Hawkes Bay, M arlborough and Gisborne known for their Sauvignon Blanc and Chardonnay. In Otago you will discover the largest ??Pinot Noir area. To the north lie the oldest vineyards, Kumen Valley, Matua Valley, Westbrook, Martha's Vineyard, Goldwater and Te Mata, the oldest vineyard. In the south you can find the newest, Cloudy Bay, Villa Maria's, Nelson, Waipara and Gibbston Valley. Visit the smaller vineyards for their good quality and exclusively local wines.
